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All UPN deliveries are now Carbon Neutral.

The carbon footprint of all palletised freight deliveries handled by Team UPN across our UK wide partner network is now calculated and carbon offset to become Carbon Neutral.

In a first for the Pallet Network Sector, every UPN Member has full Certification for all UPN deliveries as Carbon Neutral.

"UPN are now working with Carbon Neutral Britain to offset our company's carbon emissions by investing in carbon offsetting programmes upfront for each financial quarter so deliveries are offset in real time as a proactive measure to minimise our environmental impact." commented UPN Managing Director David Brown who signed the agreement.

Carbon Neutral Britain is providing a Carbon Emissions Report based on projected figures for 2024 to clearly, accurately, and transparently demonstrate how the carbon footprint of the UPN network has been calculated and offset via the ISO 14064 and GHG Emissions Protocol accounting standards. These are the two largest and most recognised methods for carbon footprint calculation in the World used by the UK Government and all public agencies. The report confirms how emissions have been validated and offset via CNB, with third party assurance.

"At UPN we have a real commitment to do what we can to help protect our planet," said David Brown, "Team UPN, all our staff, all our members, all our suppliers are fully committed to help us to drive forward this very important initiative. Furthermore, UPN are hoping that by being the first network to go Carbon Neutral we will encourage others to follow so that as a sector we can all make a real difference."

RHA launch "Driving for Growth"

In January the RHA has set out its vision calling for more support for the haulage sector in a new campaign manifesto to help drive economic growth. The Manifesto sets out recommendations to support the sector with its many challenges. These include:

- Relieving the tax burden to support economic growth
- An emissions-linked fuel duty rebate
- A Net Zero roadmap
 Roads investment
- Planning reform to secure more facilities
- Reforms to plug skills gap

Richard Smith, RHA Managing Director, said, "We're facing huge challenges as we tackle unsustainable cost increases, inadequate infrastructure and driver facilities, a major skills gap, and the transition to Net Zero. A recent report concluded that more than 450 haulage firms went bust last year which is twice as many as the year before, so we need to act fast. Our manifesto articulates the key issues our members and others face as cost pressures hit hard, and offers solutions to ease those burdens and drive economic growth."

"..The Green Shoots of Recovery..." says New Report

Data indicates that the UK's electric heavy goods vehicle market is predicted to see a 70% growth by 2026, a welcome step to net zero. However, such large-scale deployment of these new-generation HGVs could prove challenging for logistics businesses unless their staff are equipped to handle ongoing maintenance and repairs.

To assist logistics businesses in upskilling their maintenance teams, Logistics UK has formed a partnership with SMB College (Stephenson, Melton and Brooksby) and Bristol College to launch a new programme of learning and development for logistics engineers.

The new courses, which last for two days, include modules on working safely on an electric/hybrid vehicle, using information to carry out the task, knowledge on carrying out repairs on high energy electrical systems and recording information and making suitable recommendations, all delivered in a highly practical way with lots of hands-on training throughout.

This will lead to an IMI Level 2/3 qualification in Electric/Hybrid Vehicle Routine Maintenance, and the inclusion on the IMI TechSafe© register.

In April UPN launched - "SmartFREIGHT" – what it believes is now the most extensive range of pallet size options available within the sector.

New in to the SmartFREIGHT "family", and targeting a clear market niche is the "Quarter Plus Pallet" with a maximum base of 1.2 metres by 1.2 metres, a height limit of 1.1 metres, and a weight cap of 400 kilos.

"UPN SmartFREIGHT is a leap forward in convenience, flexibility, and excellence for service users", said UPN MD David Brown, "At UPN, we understand that the right size and fit matters, whether it's small freight or oversized cargo. That's why, for 2024, we've expanded our pallet freight shipping options to now offer six Pallet footprint choices together with a range of OOG (Out of Gauge) and XL options".



FARSLEY GO ELECTRIC

Farsley Transport highly valued founder member have given a big boost to the "UPN Sustainability Commitment". The leading Leeds based haulier are the first company in Yorkshire to go electric.



"We're really proud to be the first company in Yorkshire to have an articulated Volvo EV on a fleet", said Neil Chappelow – Farsley Transport Founder Owner

"The primary reason we've introduced it is to show that we're going green, and are actively looking at ways to reduce our carbon footprint including having an electric truck on the road. But it's

also about building awareness. It's not only about us contributing to the climate change challenge but encouraging others to do so too".

"It's not an easy task in our industry but we're taking positive steps. It will lower our emissions. If it can work for us then it can work for other hauliers too."

The new Volvo Electric FM is driven by three electric motors, with a continuous overall output of 490kW (666hp). This goes through a 12-speed I-Shift automated gearbox to a 12-tonne drive axle. It carries a total of 540kWh of power in six batteries, three of which are mounted on each side of the 3,900mm chassis, giving a total range of up to 300km.

"Our new Volvo Electric FM seals our commitment to supporting a more sustainable

and greener future for our industry. We are very proud to be leading the way to reduce our carbon footprint and this is just the first milestone in our sustainability journey. The future is Green, the future is Farsley!"
